Just a bit from Fr. Schmidt

Behold Your Mother

The third of Jesus' Last Words is what He says to His Mother Mary and to His beloved disciple standing beneath the Cross. Found in the Gospel according to St. John, there is one other time at the beginning of the Gospel that Jesus addresses His mother with the title "Woman." Before performing His first miracle at the wedding feast in Cana, Jesus also calls Mary "Woman," not to distance Himself from His own mother, but as an indication that this miracle would set Him on the road leading to the Cross, the same road that would lead her to becoming the "Mother of all the living," instead of simply being His own mother. He gives her the title "Woman" to show that she would need to embrace all humanity as her own children.

It is especially through the agony of that mother's Immaculate Heart—as she witnessed the Passion and Death of her beloved Son—that she became mother also to all who would be reborn into Christ Jesus through baptism, to all members of the Church which is Christ's own Body. Because Mary was free from all sin, it is believed that she was spared the pangs of childbirth—which in Genesis are portrayed as a consequence of original sin—when she gave birth to Jesus at Christmas, but she would not be spared from suffering beneath the Cross as she became mother to the rest of His members.

"When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing nearby, he said to his mother, 'Woman, behold, your son!' Then he said to the disciple, 'Behold, your mother!' And from that hour the disciple took her into his own home" (John 19:26-27). When St. John the Evangelist mentions in his gospel "the disciple whom Jesus loved" or the "beloved disciple," he is understood to be speaking in reference to himself. John is the beloved disciple. I suspect one of the reasons he uses the phrase—instead of simply just saying "I"—is because we the readers are

meant to see ourselves in his place. Of course, the main reason for writing his gospel is so that we, too, might witness these saving events through his eyes, and come to know ourselves with him as disciples "beloved by Jesus."

Thus, every disciple who is loved by Christ should receive Mary as our Mother and bring her not only into our home, but into all our lives. The original Greek does not include the word "home," but simply says the disciple brought her into "his own," really into everything that was his. We honor Christ's dying wish by taking Mary as our own Mother and asking her to guide us into our heavenly homeland.

Peaceful Vigil— 40 Days for Life is a spiritual engine that has driven a lot of success of the prolife movement. The ACLU called 40 Days for Life the "greatest threat to choice" because it is so "highly organized and effective." Prayer, Fasting and Peaceful Vigil
