Just a bit from Fr. Schmidt

Home Missions and 40 Hours

Besides being the Major Rogation Day, this Sunday we're also supposed to collect contributions for the 2021 Home Missions Appeal. Since I didn't get the contribution envelopes set out in time, we'll keep collecting them for a couple more Sundays as well. You're welcome to put them in with the regular collection. The Home Missions is a way for the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops to coordinate support for dioceses that have trouble meeting their expenses. The Dioceses of Rapid City and of Fargo are the closest ones that receive support through this appeal. It's totally up to you if you'd like to contribute or not, but the envelopes will be available in the narthex (main entryway) of each parish.

Not wanting to get caught off-guard again, I'm looking forward already to this year's 40 Hours Devotion in each parish. If you recall, last year, we began the season of Lent with 40 Hours of Eucharistic Exposition, the first weekend in one parish and the second weekend in the other. Of course, the night hours are the most difficult to fill, so we start with a 6 am Mass on a Saturday morning and have exposition until 10 pm on Sunday, needing to fill just the one night in between.

This year, I'd like to have our 40 Hours Devotion in conjunction with two great Feastdays. In **Bowdle**, we'll plan on the weekend of Pentecost, so starting on Saturday, **May 22**, through **Pentecost Sunday** on **May 23**. In **Hoven**, for the Feast of **Corpus Christi**, which is transferred to Sunday, we'll start on Saturday, **June 5**, and go through Sunday, **June 6**. We've got some time, but I'll be putting out signup sheets in the coming weeks for you to take specific hours. I also try to stagger the second slot so that if more than one person is there for a given hour, they're not both arriving or leaving at the same time. So one column will have increments such as 8 to 9 while the second column you can sign up for 8:30 to 9:30.

I was very impressed last year that all the hours were covered. It's extremely important that we never leave Jesus unattended while He's exposed in the monstrance, both out of reverence for Christ and to make sure no one would wander in to steal or do anything sacrilegious. The church doors lock automatically during the night in Hoven, so those who sign up for those hours need a key fab to get in. Those used for the adoration chapel also work on the handicap accessible door on the outside of the church.
