Use Your Freedom or Lose It

Happy Independence Day to one and all! I've always loved being from the United States, and during this past year especially, I've loved being a South Dakotan. As I was growing up, I was convinced that pretty much everyone in the world really wished they could have been born in the US. Since traveling to other parts of the world, I've met a lot of people who at least pretend that they don't mind living somewhere else, but one of my favorite lines from a TV show is still from *The Office*, when Creed says, "I already won the lottery. I was born in the US of A, baby!"

Today, we should be mindful of all those who lived, worked, fought, and died over the centuries to make our country great. It's especially ordinary people at the local level who have helped our nation achieve its greatest accomplishments. And this remains more true than ever as the politicians in Washington increasingly separate themselves and their concern from the ordinary lives of Americans to serve instead the interests of huge corporations and international oligarchs. With all that goes on at sort of the "macro" level, we need to not lose sight of the opportunities to better ourselves each day in those things we can actually control and influence, especially to grow in the virtues and to root out sin in our own words and actions.

Over the years, when I would consider the atrocities that still exist in our country, I would take some comfort in remembering that even though our country's laws and institutions don't always encourage virtuous action or discourage vice, each of us still enjoys the freedom to do the right thing and follow God's will without too much difficulty or at least without getting into legal trouble over it. In more recent years, though, even our most basic freedoms have come more and more under threat. If we want these liberties to be available for future generations, we need to continue to exercise them even as the risk increases for suffering unjust actions in response.

If we truly wish to honor the legacy of those who lived and died defending our freedoms, we'll make use of them even as it becomes more difficult to do so. First and foremost in our duty toward God, our religious liberty demands that we not just serve God hidden within the walls of a church but that the Catholic faith informs everything we say and do, every day of the week and in every place. Despite what some spineless politicians might tell you, religion and love of God are not a private matter. "Whoever denies Me before men will be denied before the angels of God" (Lk. 12:9). Proclaim the Good News of Christ, "in season and out of season" (2 Tim. 4:2). God bless you and your families, and God bless America.
