We have chartered a 55-passenger bus to take area pro-lifers down to the Hour of Reflection and the Life Chain Walk on Sunday, January 30<sup>th</sup>. The bus will pick up and drop off people in Aberdeen, Ipswich, Roscoe, Bowdle, Hoven, Gettysburg, and elsewhere along the way if needed. We will arrive in Pierre for the Life Chain Walk around the capitol by 12:00 PM. People are encouraged to bring their Right to Life banners or other pro-life signs. At 1:00 PM refreshments and snacks will be served in the capitol. At 2:00 PM the Hour of Reflection program entitled "The Sanctity of Human Life" will be held in the capitol rotunda featuring a number of remarkably inspirational pro-life speakers along with entertainment. The bus will head back at around 3:30 PM.

Just a bit from Fr. Schmidt

Do Penance

With the extra Confessions leading up to Christmas, there’s something I noticed while listening to people recite the Act of Contrition, and I’ve been thinking about it ever since. There are different versions and options for the Act of Contrition, so I didn’t hear this from everyone, nor is it really wrong to say it this way, but from more than a few, I heard, “I firmly resolve with the help of thy grace to confess my sins, to do my penance, and to amend my life” or “...to do the penance...”

So, what’s my point? The way I learned the prayer and how I find it printed in prayerbooks and aids—and the way I would argue it was originally composed and intended to be prayed—is just with the words “...to do penance...” instead of *my* penance or *the* penance, which tends to refer merely to the one that the priest just assigned to you. Our resolve “to do penance” should certainly include the specific penance assigned to us within the Sacrament of Confession, but it should also go beyond that. As Christians, penitence should be a regular and overarching part of our lives. If the only penance we ever do is what we have specifically assigned to us, we’re not really denying ourselves, taking up our cross daily, and following Christ, as we are called to do.

I’ve referred to this before as Christian *asceticism*, from the Greek word for discipline. Penitence would be another name for it, specifically under the aspect of making reparation for our sins. Our sins involve and reinforce a disordered attachment to pleasure and to the things of this passing world. Repairing this disorder in us requires cooperation with God’s grace, not only to receive His forgiveness and mercy, but to build a habit of using things wisely and with moderation, without overindulgence and binging (cf. 1 Cor. 7:31).

The early Christians were known for their asceticism, their self-control and regular penance. Along with Fridays, Wednesdays and Saturdays were regular days of penance, fasting, abstaining from meat, and not just during Lent. With so much to pray for these days, with so many of my own sins—let alone the sins of those who come to me for Confession—for which I should be making reparation, I’ve tried to be more deliberate about offering God some form of penance every Friday and even on Wednesdays and Saturdays or more often.

If we wonder how the world got so far gone and how to start bringing it back to some sanity, we might start by recapturing the habit of Christian penitence, not just to do *your* penance or *the* penance, but *do penance* on a regular basis.
