Just a bit from Fr. Schmidt

Set Free for Heaven

Even as we pray and give thanks for those who died while defending freedom and serving in our nation's military this Monday, on Sunday we observe the great mystery of Christ's Ascension into heavenly glory. In an important way, the Ascension completes the work of our redemption that the Son of God began in earnest when He first took to Himself a human nature like our own in the Immaculate Virgin's womb. Through all the ordinary events of His time as a Fetus, Infant, Child, Man, Jesus sanctified and consecrated the events and stages of our own lives.

And Christ conquered sin and death precisely by enduring death for us upon the Cross, the Innocent Lamb taking away the sins of the world and ransoming us from slavery. "For freedom Christ set us free" (Gal. 5:1). But this freedom that Christ won for us is not confined to any nation or land upon this earth, even though it should begin for us even now. In the Ascension, in the sharing now of our human nature in the surpassing glory that the Son enjoyed with the Father and the Holy Spirit even before the world existed, our true homeland and destiny has been revealed.

"Our citizenship is in heaven, and we also await a Savior from heaven, the Lord Jesus Christ, who will transform our lowly bodies to be like His glorious Body" (Phil. 3:20-21). On Memorial Day, as we pay honor to those who made the ultimate sacrifice for the freedoms we enjoy in this country and in this passing world, we do so because their sacrifice was modeled after His, which sets us free to live for our true and lasting homeland, the life of the world to come, "where moth and rust cannot destroy, nor thieves break in and steal" (Mt. 6:20).

We also look towards the great Feast of Pentecost. We join ourselves to the Blessed Mother and the Apostles in that **original novena**, nine days of prayer between the Ascension and the arrival of the Promise of the Father, the Advocate and Spirit of Truth. The same Fire and Power of God that sanctified the human nature of Christ and worked with Him in all "the works that the Father has given Me to accomplish," that same Holy Spirit desires to dwell in us today and bring about the renewal and fruitfulness in the Church that only the Power of God can accomplish (Jn. 5:36). *Come, Holy Ghost! Fill the hearts of Thy faithful! Kindle in them the Fire of Thy Love!*
