Just a bit from Fr. Schmidt

Fill Up What Is Lacking

You probably know by now a bit about how the three-year Sunday Lectionary is structured, with Year A focusing mostly on the Gospel according to St. Matthew, Year B for St. Mark, Year C for St. Luke, and St. John scattered in and around the special seasons and feasts with several weeks of Year B for the Bread of Life Discourse. What you probably haven't noticed is how each Scripture passage for a given Sunday in Ordinary Time is related or unrelated to each of the others.

As you might expect, the main focus is the Gospel passage, so from week to week, these just go in sequence through the Gospel of that year. Then the Old Testament reading is chosen deliberately to go with that Gospel passage, sharing at least some thematic relation, like the exercise of hospitality by Abraham and Sarah, Mary and Martha this Sunday. Similarly, the responsorial Psalm is paired with the Old Testament reading that precedes it.

Unlike these, the New Testament passage of the second reading—during these Sundays in Ordinary Time—is not chosen specifically based on its themes, but, like the Gospel passage, just goes in sequence from week to week through some of the epistles. This Sunday, we're still in the first chapter of St. Paul's Letter to the Colossians, which we started last Sunday after hearing from the final chapters of Galatians on the two previous Sundays. If the second reading does happen to share some themes with the other readings during Ordinary Time, this tends to be more accidental than by design. This unfortunately means that these beautiful passages of the epistles do not often get much

treatment in homilies, as they tend to be related less to the themes actually shared between the Gospel, Old Testament reading and Psalm.

The second reading this week is one of the most interesting passages—and most unhelpfully translated in modern Bibles. The word order and grammar of St. Paul's Greek tends to be a lot clearer than many English renderings: "Now I rejoice in the sufferings for you, and I fill up what is lacking of the afflictions of the Christ in my flesh, for His Body which is the Church." What is lacking is *not* any value in the sufferings Christ endured for us upon the Cross, which is the sacrifice of His perfect obedience. What is lacking is the conformity and configuration of my own flesh to the mysteries of the Passion of Christ, "bearing always the death of Jesus in our body, so that the life of Jesus should also be manifested in our body" (2 Cor. 4:10). All the mysteries of Christ are meant to be lived in us, but we often rebel against the more painful ones. Christ bears these with us. Even when we feel alone in our suffering, He is there beside us, within us.
