Stay Sober and Alert

For well over a decade now, the Catholic Bishops in South Dakota, both of Sioux Falls and of Rapid City, have often worked to come to a joint statement on certain ballot measures that pertain to Catholic teaching and morality. This effort to speak with a united voice on issues that affect members of the faithful and of the wider society in both dioceses reflects the right and duty of the Church “to preach the faith, to teach her social doctrine, to exercise her role freely among men, and also to pass moral judgment in those matters which regard public order when the fundamental rights of a person or the salvation of souls require it” (*Gaudium et Spes*, n. 76).

This effort on the part of the Bishops to speak clearly to members of the faithful about our civic responsibilities, along with a desire to have someone to represent Catholic concerns to South Dakota legislators, gave rise to the formation of the **South Dakota Catholic Conference** (<https://sdcatholicconference.org/>). The website is a great resource to find summaries of Catholic teaching pertaining to upcoming ballot measures and statements from our Bishops.

One of the latest is a joint statement from Bishops DeGrood and Muhich, urging Catholics and all South Dakotans to **oppose Initiated Measure 27**, which would legalize the recreational use of marijuana. Because of the effects of a mind-altering chemical present in marijuana known as delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol (THC)—and in concentrations today around three times what they were 25 years ago—non-medicinal or recreational use of marijuana cannot be morally justified in good conscience. Our faculty for rational thought and decision is one of the primary ways we image God, so we must not lightly relinquish or impair our mind and will to a significant degree through the use of drugs.

In their joint statement, the Bishops focus more on the wider effects for society, including increased incidence of vehicle crashes, including fatalities, workplace accidents, injuries, and absences, substance addiction, and decreased numbers of graduations and degree attainment. Data from other States that have already approved recreational use make clear its ill effects on both a personal level and in society as a whole. “The night is nearly over; the day has drawn near. So let us lay aside the deeds of darkness and put on the armor of light. Let us behave decently, as in the daytime, not in carousing and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and debauchery, not in dissension and jealousy. Instead, clothe yourselves with the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the desires of the flesh” (Rom. 13:12-14).
