<u>Anointing of the Sick & Last Rites:</u> Contact Father to make arrangements: 605-971-4556 option 3.



Fr. Michael's Musings

This, then, is the good zeal which monks must foster with fervent love: They should each try to be the first to show respect to the other (Romans 12:10), supporting with the greatest patience one another's weaknesses of body or behavior, and earnestly competing in obedience to one another.

- Rule of Saint Benedict 72: 3-6

The heart of community living, according to St. Benedict, is the ability to care for one another. He



speaks of showing respect, being patient, and competing to be the most obedient to each other.

This is not, however, the way of the world, is it?

It is really a new way of living (and this passage was shocking even in Benedict's day). Yet, what greater gift is there than to live in a community, or a pastorate, which is focused on the care and respect we give to each other. There is a freedom there to grow in safety and love.

Mistakes will be made, annoyances occur, disagreements arise, and in them all, St. Benedict reminds the monks to never grow tired of being patient, and understanding of each other. If that is not there, those mistakes, annoyances and disagreements will destroy the monastery.

It is a matter of life and death.

It is founded on "obedience," which comes from the Latin word obedire, meaning to listen or pay attention. Thus our obedience is not being passive slaves, but people with the courage to notice one another, and to listen to one another; from which the grace of empathy arises.

This is our path as we begin living a new reality as Pastorate 1. May God give us the good zeal to show the world what living our faith in love truly means.



Saint Bridget of Sweden's Story

From age 7 on, Bridget had visions of Christ crucified. Her visions formed the basis for her activity—always with the emphasis on charity rather than spiritual favors.

She lived her married life in the court of the Swedish King Magnus II. Mother of eight children—the second eldest was Saint Catherine of Sweden—Bridget lived the strict life of a penitent after her husband's death. Bridget constantly strove to exert her good influence over Magnus; while never fully reforming, he did give her land and buildings to found a monastery for men and women.

In 1350, a year of jubilee, Bridget braved a plague-stricken Europe to make a pilgrimage to Rome. Although she never returned to Sweden, her years in Rome were far from happy, being hounded by debts and by opposition to her work against Church abuses. A final pilgrimage to the Holy Land, marred by shipwreck and the death of her son, Charles, eventually led to her death in 1373. In 1999, Bridget, Saint Catherine of Siena and Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, were named copatronesses of Europe.
