Father Michael's Musings



As part of our planning process for the Pastorate of the Visitation, the planning committee was asked to put together a plan for when the pastorate will be served by one 2 full-time priests.

This is obviously a difficult task, but it is necessary due to the simple reality that, with ordinations not keeping up with retirements, there are, and will be, fewer full-time priests in the diocese.

We have long been working to help produce vocations to the Priesthood in our parishes, praying the Vocations Prayer, offering rosaries, etc. These are important, and we must continue to grow in the intention of fostering vocations so that, at some future day, we have many priests to serve our beautiful diocese.

One way we can intentionally foster vocations to the Priesthood is by falling in love with the celebration of the Eucharist as the heart of our lives. I am not referring here to Eucharistic adoration, but of the celebration of the Mass, of listening to the Word, of offering ourselves, and of the absolute importance of receiving Communion.

The words are chosen carefully...to fall in love. That takes time and vulnerability, that takes giving and receiving, that brings life. Nothing takes its place in our lives.

As each of us pause and reflect on this gift where we are given the fullness of life, and the unimaginable joy of physical union with the Living God, we grow in love, in faith and in hope.

No young man begins his discernment of God's call to the Priesthood without being in love with the celebration of the Eucharist. This begins in his youth, in the family, and continues to grow. This is where every vocation begins, falling in love with the celebration of the Eucharist.

In this renewed love, we face the future together. We may find ourselves celebrating the Eucharist at different times or in different places, but a people in love with the celebration will sacrifice joyfully to have this gift enliven them.

Our future is being brought to life now, today, in us. May each of us, priests and people, fall in love again, that the future might be blessed, and the next generation more freely hear God's call to love in Marriage, love in the Priesthood, love how Christ calls us to love.

Saint Bernadette Soubirous' Story

Bernadette Soubirous was born in 1844, the first child of an extremely poor miller in the town of Lourdes in southern France. The family was living in the basement of a dilapidated

building when on February 11, 1858, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to Bernadette in a cave above the banks of the Gave River near Lourdes. Bernadette, 14 years old, was known as a virtuous girl though a dull student who had not even made her first Holy Communion. In poor health, she had suffered from asthma from an early age.

There were 18 appearances in all, the final one occurring on the feast of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, July 16. Although Bernadette's initial reports provoked skepticism, her daily visions of "the Lady" brought great crowds of the curious. The Lady, Bernadette explained, had instructed her to have a chapel built on the spot of the visions. There, the people were to come to wash in and drink of the water of the spring that had welled up from the very spot where Bernadette had been instructed to dig.

According to Bernadette, the Lady of her visions was a girl of 16 or 17 who wore a white robe with a blue sash. Yellow roses covered her feet, a large rosary was on her right arm. In the vision on March 25 she told Bernadette, "I am the Immaculate Conception." It was only when the words were explained to her that Bernadette came to realize who the Lady was.

During her life, Bernadette suffered much. She was hounded by the public as well as by civic officials until at last she was protected in a convent of nuns. Five years later, she petitioned to enter the Sisters of Notre Dame of Nevers. After a period of illness she was able to make the journey from Lourdes and enter the novitiate. But within four months of her arrival she was given the last rites of the Church and allowed to profess her vows. She recovered enough to become infirmarian and then sacristan, but chronic health problems persisted. She died on April 16, 1879, at the age of 35. Bernadette Soubirous was canonized in 1933.
