

# **Protect life in South Dakota** Amendment G legalizes abortion in South Dakota

# The SD Abortion Amendment **Explained**

<u>1st trimester:</u> Because of the vague word 'effectuation. meaning "to bring about," the State would be completely prohibited from enacting any abortion regulations. BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF SOUTH DAKOTA: Adding abortion to our State's Constitution tate's Constitution would take away the people's

the people's ability to that Article VI of the Constitution of the State of South Dakota be legislative process. amended by adding a NEW SECTION:

health/safety protections for women getting an abortion would be banned.

2nd trimester: Abortion would still be legalized for any reason, even after the child is viable outside of the womb.

Before the end of the first trimester. the State may not regulate a pregnant woman's abortion decision and its effectuation, which must be left to the judgement of the pregnant woman.

After the end of the first trimester and until the end of the second trimester, the State may regulate the pregnant woman's abortion decision and its effectuation only in ways that are reasonably related to the physical health of the pregnant woman.

Only after the start of the 2nd trimester could the State impose safety standards on abortion facilities that would protect women from unsafe abortions.

<u>3rd trimester:</u> The U.S. The U.S. Supreme Court defined 'health' to include 'all' factors - physical, emotional, psychological, familial, and the woman's age." This broad definition of 'health' would health' would **a**llow for **abortion** all the way to the point of birth.

After the end of the second trimester, the State may regulate or prohibit The 'physician, in this case. abortion, except when abortion is necessary, in the medical judgment of the woman's physician, to preserve the life or health of the pregnant woman.

#### **The Story of Our Lady of Sorrows**

For a while there were two feasts in honor of the Sorrowful Mother: one going back to the 15th century, the other to the 17th century. For

a while both were celebrated by the universal Church: one on the Friday before Palm Sunday, the other in September.

The principal biblical references to Mary's sorrows are in Luke 2:35 and John 19:26-27. The Lucan passage is Simeon's prediction about a sword piercing Mary's soul; the Johannine passage relates Jesus' words from the cross to Mary and to the beloved disciple.

Many early Church writers interpret the sword as Mary's sorrows, especially as she saw Jesus die on the cross. Thus, the two passages are brought together as prediction and fulfillment.

Saint Ambrose in particular sees Mary as a sorrowful yet powerful figure at the cross. Mary stood fearlessly at the cross while others fled and she looked on her Son's wounds with pity, but saw in them the salvation of the world. As Jesus hung on the cross, Mary did not fear to be killed, but offered herself to her persecutors.
