The Solemnity of the Epiphany / Three Kings Day

Today we celebrate Epiphany, one of the oldest Christian feast days, which remembers the magi's journey as they followed the star of Bethlehem in search of the foretold King of Kings. It's also known as the "Three Kings Day". Epiphany means "appearance" or "manifestation," aptly describing what the magi would find once the star "stopped over the place where the child was" and refers, generally, to Jesus being manifested to the gentile visitors from the East.

Here is the visit in the Gospel according to Matthew, Chapter 2: "When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, ... behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, 'Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage.' And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh."

As it happens, Magi are not kings – they were astrologers and possibly Zoroastrian priests. The identification of the Magi as kings is linked to Old Testament prophesies that have the Messiah being worshipped by kings in Isaiah 60:3, Psalm 72:10, and Psalm 68:29. Early readers reinterpreted Matthew in light of these prophecies and elevated the Magi to kings. By AD 500 all commentators adopted the prevalent tradition that the three were kings. And the text never says there are three – we just infer that from the number of gifts. But in any case, we are celebrating the visit of the first Gentile worshippers of the Savior.

Three gifts are explicitly identified in Matthew: gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Many different theories of the meaning and symbolism of the gifts have been brought forward. While gold is fairly obviously explained, frankincense, and particularly myrrh, are much more obscure. The theories generally break down into two groups:

- All three gifts are ordinary offerings and gifts given to a king. Myrrh being commonly used as an anointing oil,
 frankincense as a perfume, and gold as a valuable.
- The three gifts had a spiritual meaning: gold as a symbol of kingship on earth, frankincense (an incense) as a symbol of deity, and myrrh (an embalming oil) as a symbol of death.
