

Father Michael's Musings



On Saturday, January 17, the Church celebrated the Feast of St. Anthony of the Desert.

In the early 4th Century, Anthony began his spiritual quest by becoming a disciple of one of the hermits close by, but ultimately, he became the first to enter the desert itself to give himself totally to prayer, penance and spiritual growth in solitude.

He spent the majority of his life alone with the Lord. In the desert, with its quiet, solitude and struggles, he discovered himself, and then gave that gift fully to the Lord Jesus.

He is an example for us. Not so much a call to live as a desert hermit, but the call to recognize the value of time spent in quiet solitude with the Lord.

“Wait, Father,” I hear you and I say, “we’re busy, busy, busy. How can we do that?”

Being busy, like finding time to spend in solitude, is a choice; we choose to be busy, if even subconsciously. We choose to make sure our calendar is filled, we choose to make sure our kids are involved in everything. We choose to do these things because they meet some need within us. But there is also a need in us for quiet time with the Lord. We will never discover who we really are in being busy. We will never truly know the gift of our life if we cannot pause for some time with the One who loves us best.

How can our Christian youth hear the Lord call them if we have not taught them to quietly listen? How can we listen unless we choose to finally be quiet enough, to set down our prayer book for a time and just “be” with Him?

The Lord knows it isn’t easy, but it’s easier than being busy all the time.

“Be still,” Psalm 46 tells us, “and know I that I am God.” St. Anthony of the Desert, pray for us, that we might always choose wisely.

Saint Francis de Sales

August 21, 1567 – December 28, 1622)



Saint Francis de Sales was destined by his father to be a lawyer and take his place as a senator from the province of Savoy in France. After receiving his doctorate, he returned home and told his parents he wished to enter the priesthood.

His father strongly opposed Francis in this, and only after much patient persuasiveness on the part of the gentle

Francis, did his father finally consent. Francis was ordained and elected provost of the Diocese of Geneva, who set out to convert them; by preaching and distributing the little pamphlets he wrote to explain true Catholic doctrine, he had remarkable success.

At 35, he became bishop of Geneva. While administering his diocese he continued to preach, hear confessions, and catechize the children. His gentle character was a great asset in winning souls. He practiced his own axiom, "A spoonful of honey attracts more flies than a barrelful of vinegar."

Besides his two well-known books, the *Introduction to the Devout Life* and *A Treatise on the Love of God*, he wrote many pamphlets and carried on a vast correspondence. For his writings, he has been named patron of the Catholic Press. His writings, filled with his characteristic gentle spirit, are addressed to lay people. He wants to make them understand that they too are called to be saints.

Reflection: Saint Francis de Sales took seriously the words of Christ, "Learn of me for I am meek and humble of Heart." As he said himself, it took him 20 years to conquer his quick temper, but no one ever suspected he had such a problem, so overflowing with good nature and kindness was his usual manner of acting. His perennial meekness & sunny disposition won him the title of "Gentleman Saint."
