Father Michael's Musings



As I write this, I have no idea who is playing in the Super Bowl....heck, I don't even know who is playing this weekend (I just know it's not the Vikings).

But these games have me thinking about what one hears during the NFL playoffs, and before them, and after them.

The expectations we have for football teams:

- * First, the goal is to make it to the playoffs, and if you don't then the season is a disaster (regardless of the record).
- * Or they make the playoffs, but if you lose in the wild card game, the season is a disaster.
- * Or they move ahead in the playoffs, but don't make it to the Super Bowl, so the season is a disaster.
 - * Or they make it to the Super Bowl, but lose, and the season is a disaster.

And it never ends. Dan Marino and Fran Tarkenton were great quarterbacks, but...they never won a Super Bowl and so....

That is fine, I suppose, for the NFL and its numberless commentators, pundits and vocal fans; but it is a danger if we begin to think this way about life.

As Christians looking at our lives, there are a multitude of ways we can measure success and victory. The small battles won, the moments of powerful grace, the rising up from falling, the failures and success, all are a part of the journey, and the journey is what matters.

St. Paul himself never says he won...he simply looks back and says: I have competed well; I have finished the race; I have kept the faith. (2 Tim. 4:7)

That's our Lombardi Trophy.

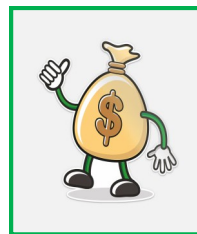

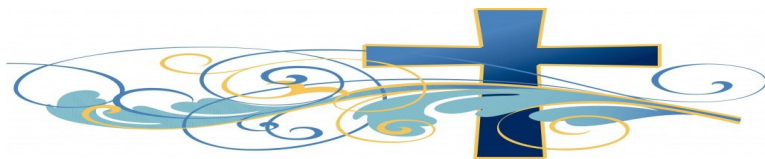


Last Collar Standing – Plan Your Watch Party

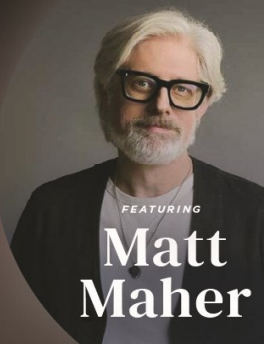

Saint John Bosco

(August 16, 1815 – January 31, 1888)



Saint John Bosco's theory of education was a preventive system, rejecting corporal punishment and placing students in surroundings removed from the likelihood of committing sin. He

advocated frequent reception of the sacraments of Penance and Holy Communion. He combined catechetical training and fatherly guidance, seeking to unite the spiritual life with one's work, study and play.

Encouraged during his youth in Turin to become a priest so he could work with young boys, Saint John Bosco was ordained in 1841. His service to young people started when he met a poor orphan in Turin, and instructed him in preparation for receiving Holy Communion. He then gathered young apprentices and taught them catechism.

By 1856, the Oratory of St. Francis de Sales for boys, had grown to 150 boys and had added a printing press for publication of religious and catechetical pamphlets. John's interest in vocational education and publishing justify him as patron of young apprentices and Catholic publishers.

With Pope Pius IX's encouragement, John gathered 17 men and founded the Salesians in 1859. Their activity concentrated on education and mission work. Later, he organized a group of Salesian Sisters to assist girls.

Reflection: John Bosco educated the whole person—body and soul united. He believed that Christ's love and our faith in that love should pervade everything we do—work, study, play. For John Bosco, being a Christian was a full-time effort, not a once-a-week, Mass-on-Sunday experience. It is searching and finding God and Jesus in everything we do, letting their love lead us. Yet, because John realized the importance of job-training and the self-worth and pride that come with talent and ability, he trained his students in the trade crafts, too.
